Involved with development of CAD output software at Intergraph and Byers Engineering.

Intergraph Customer Engineer in Europe from 1982-1984.

Managed 'Tiger-Team' Support Group for Intergraph's Core IGDS package from 1984-1988, certifying new releases.

Helped research and develop plotting software with Byers Engineering from 1990-1992.

Helped develop the first implementation of Dow Jones laser imaging technology with CAD software at Lellyett & Rogers.

Created standards for Architects and Engineers' CAD production for Reprographic needs to produce construction documents while with Lellyett & Rogers.

David Limbaugh made his mark on the reprographics industry during his career at Lellyett & Rogers in Nashville, TN. Lellyett & Rogers operated two divisions, its offset printing division (founded many years earlier) and it's A/E services division, which came into being many years after L&R was first founded.

David was with L&R from 1992 to 2010. As David put it, "L&R revolutionized the Reprographics Industry's output options, from Laser Film Plotting for Color Offset Printing Plate production to Advanced B/W plotting offerings." While some might consider David's statement a bold one, I do not; it is true!

I had the honor and privilege of working with L&R for a couple of years during my career at NGI (I was a "shared employee", working for both L&R and NGI.) David Limbaugh is a genius. I was in awe of his knowledge and talent. Working under the guidance/direction of the President of L&R Services, Bryan Dyer, David spearheaded the development of a system I referred to as the "APPS System" – Automated Plotting/Printing System." The development of this system, along with the tremendous large-format print capacity L&R assembled at its Nashville plant and an outstanding group of team members, led to L&R becoming the largest reprographer in the state of Tennessee, and, pound for pound, one of the most profitable reprographics businesses ever to grace the reprographics industry. Keep in mind that L&R was never in the "blueprinting" business – L&R never had a single blueprint or diazo machine! Yet, in spite of that, L&R became the dominant A/E reprographics business in its market area. L&R Services was (and, I imagine, still is) a serious player in the "FM" business. The APPS system David took part in developing was installed at every L&R Services FM-customer site. This system enhanced the productivity of L&R's A/E customers. At a customer-meeting years ago in Knoxville, I listened to one of the managing partners of a huge A/E firm (who was visiting Knoxville from his company's HQ's office in Nashville) say to L&R's President, "your system has increased our team's productivity and our company's profitability!"

One only had to listen to David Limbaugh on the phone with customers to understand his nurturing, caring manner ... and his smarts. Although he was with a reprographer, A/E people would call David for help with Intergraph issues (something not working right, they had questions) and MicroStation issues, and David would give them the answers. Given the level of service L&R's customers got, hell would freeze over before any competitor could lure away an L&R customer.
